Compulsary School Attendance

The Department of Education have recently introduced new attendance marks which applies to the recording of absences from school. It is a compulsory requirement for all school age students to attend school. As a result any absences from school will require a form to be completed and returned to the school at your earliest convenience. If no explanation is received it will result in an unexplained absence on your child's record. You may also receive reminder letters to explain these absences.

On a separate note, if you child is sick for more than 3+ consecutive days you will be required to attach a medical certificate to the absence form.

The blank absence forms will be available from the front office foyer or from your class teacher.

Reconciliation Week



National Reconciliation Week held on 27 May - 3 June is a time for all people to learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and to explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. The dates commemorate two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey – the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision respectively. The theme this year, Grounded in Truth Walk Together with Courage is asking us to continue the call for a comprehensive process of truth-telling about Australia's colonial history.

To acknowledge this all students have been discussing the significance of this and have decorated footprints which will be displayed in the edible orchard and garden. We ask students from all backgrounds to be inspired to 'walk together with courage' as they contribute to building stronger relationships based on historical acceptance.

Food Allergy Week



FOOD ALLEDGY Food Allergy Week (FAW) aims to raise awareness of food allergy including potentially fatal food allergies. Allergy & Anaphylaxis Australia (A&AA) is calling on all Australians to unite during Food Allergy Week from 26 May – 1 June 2019, and for individuals to Be Aware. Show You Care.

Australia has one of the highest incidence of food allergy in the world and this is increasing at an alarming rate: in fact, one in 10 babies born in Australia will develop a food allergy. With no known cure for food allergy, awareness and education is of utmost importance, as a severe allergic reaction and/or anaphylaxis can rapidly become life threatening, and must be treated as a medical emergency. It's important for all Australians to be aware of food allergies, and know how to respond in an emergency situation.

This week students at Telopea PS have helped raise awareness and have been involved in Food Allergy Week to show they care.

Aboriginal Culture Incursion

On Wednesday June 19th, Discover Parramatta will be presenting an interactive and informative incursion, linking in to our history syllabus.

The aim is for students to explore the past and to develop a critical understanding of the past and its impact on the present.

Students will learn of Aboriginal people's relationships to land, listen to stories about country, discover Aboriginal ways of life and hear about the first contacts between traditional custodians and settlers, including the ongoing impacts of settlement. They will learn some words in the Darug language and may try their hand at some traditional skills.
