#### **Kindergarten Enrolments 2020**

If you are happy with the educational services Telopea Public School provides to your children please feel free to inform prospective parents about the quality education provided by the staff at Telopea and the extensive programs we offer.

We have commenced taking enrolments for 2020, so if you have a child or know of anyone starting school next year who wishes to attend Telopea Public School please contact staff in the school office on 9638 1296.

#### **Compulsary School Attendance**

The Department of Education have recently introduced new attendance marks which applies to the recording of absences from school. It is a compulsory requirement for all school age students to attend school. As a result any absences from school will require a form to be completed and returned to the school at your earliest convenience. If no explanation is received it will result in an unexplained absence on your child's record. You may also receive reminder letters to explain these absences.

On a separate note, if you child is sick for more than 3+ consecutive days you will be required to attach a medical certificate to the absence form.

The blank absence forms will be available from the front office foyer or from your class teacher.


